Colonial Williamsburg - This historic area is an interpretation of a Colonial American city with restored and recreated buildings, taverns, and trade shops. Governor's Palace - Home to seven royal governors and the first two elected governors in Virginia, the Palace was meant to project British authority and wealth. Lunch at a Colonial Tavern Jamestown Settlement - Another historic area, this living-history park and museum tells the story of 17th Century Virginia form the arrival of the settlers in 1607 to the cultures of the Powhattan Indians and Africans in the colony.
